Curriculum Intent Statement

The National Curriculum for art and design aims to ensure that all pupils:

- know about great artists, craft makers and designers, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms.

Intent

Children will be equipped with the skills and knowledge to successfully think, work, and communicate like an artist. Skills are revisited and honed across the different years through increasing degrees of challenge and complexity. Children will have an awareness of a broad range of artists and be able to consider and discuss the artworks they come across. They will have opportunities to take inspiration from these key artists and create their own artworks in their styles.
